If you think you need to replant your crop, please contact us immediately. The replant provisions state that the replant must be 20 acres or 20% of the total field. To be paid, please keep your seed receipts and any other expenses you have related to replanting.

In order for losses to be paid correctly, please understand all losses must be reported immediately - even if you plan on taking it to harvest.

Preventive Planting...

Many of you have been asking if there will be preventive planting for this year. The answer is yes. As in the past, drought or failure of irrigation water supply will be considered to be an insurable cause of loss for the purposes of prevented planting only if on the final planting date: there is not a reasonable probability of having adequate water to carry out an irrigated practice.

All though you may be concerned about your current water situation, please keep in mind that as we get closer to the final plant date on each crop, we will all have a better idea of what your individual situation will be.
